**SITUATION REPORT**  
**January 11, 2008 14:00 hours**

**Severe Storms and Tornadoes**  
*Updated Information in Italics*

**Current Situation**

A complex of severe storms containing multiple tornados swept through the region Monday evening and overnight, involving multiple tornado touchdowns in Laclede County.

**Discipline Specific Reports**

**Public Safety:** Fire & Law Enforcement have conducted searches of debris for injured persons, all known debris fields and hazards have been cleared. Two patients were transported to a local hospital with moderate injuries when the mobile home they were evacuating was struck by a tornado. *Public Safety Agency Operations have since returned to normal.*

**Health/Hospital:** St. Johns Hospital – Lebanon reports seeing 7 patients with storm related injuries, 6 have since been released, and 1 transferred to a Springfield Hospital. Other non-hospitalized injuries bring the total to approximately 12 patients.

**Public Works:** Laclede Electric Co-Op reports approximately 20 customers without power, City of Lebanon reports all power restored. *Laclede Electric Co-Op reports all power restored.*

**Red Cross:** *The Laclede County Chapter of the American Red Cross continues to work with clients to meet their immediate needs for housing and clothing pending any Federal Declaration.*

**Emergency Mgmt:** The EOC remains activated, and is conducting damage assessments. At this time, two distinct separate tornado tracks

have been identified. The first is north of I-44 and stretches from Phillipsburg to near Mile Marker 123. The second is a continuation of the Webster County tornado that caused the fatality near Sampson; and stretches from east of Conway, to south of Lebanon, to near Russ, to the Sunnyview & Drynob areas, where it appears to have dissipated. *Damage assessment is now complete and FEMA IA & PA PDA Teams have been in Laclede County to survey damage. Current totals are below.*
